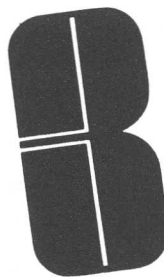

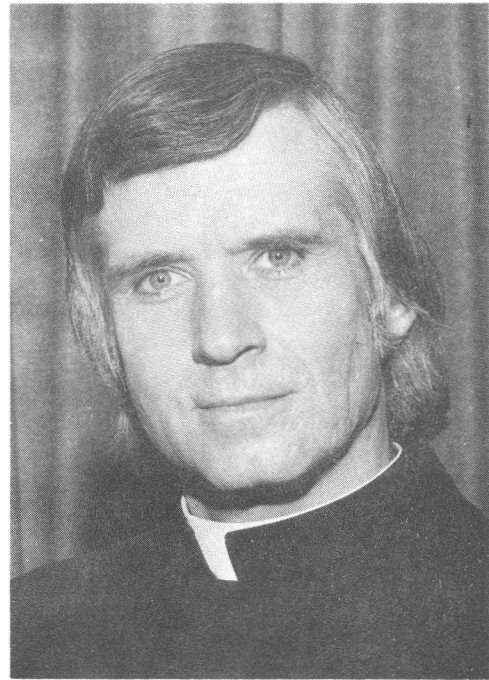

Meet Our "Mr. Nice Guy"

Our annual "Mr. Nice Guy" award this year goes to a man who makes the meaning of the award's title an understatement. He is Father Vaughan Quinn, who is the Director of the Sacret Heart Rehabilitation Center in Detroit. The Center is 'home' for many — and a start on the recovery road for some of the area's unfortunate alcoholics.

Father Quinn came to the Center in 1967, having himself just recovered from the same addiction; and he has spent untiring efforts in helping those who, to others, would appear to be beyond help.

The Center moved to its present location on East Elizabeth in 1972 and has 120 beds. In addition, there are half-way houses with a total of 40 beds and an extended-care facility in Memphis, Michigan, for 160 persons. The Center is not affiliated with the Church, and is governed by an independend Board. There is heavy emphasis on the Alcoholics' Anonymous concept, and the program takes about 17 weeks.

Father Quinn is an avid hockey player, tending goal for the "Flying Fathers," a group of Priests playing for charity in Canada and the U.S. He also has a hobby of collecting antique fire engines — is a lover of St. Bernard dogs — and when he can find a few spare minutes, you'll find him playing the banjo. He was born in Montreal in 1933, and was ordained a Priest in the Order of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate in 1964.

Father Quinn says his goal is to "continue to work to help people experience *freedom ... freedom from themselves — not just freedom from booze.*"

From the vantage point of the community — it would appear that, to a large degree, Father Quinn's goal has been achieved.
