

CARL DAHLKE

Perhaps the greatest tribute to the talent of Carl Dahlke, who steps down this weekend as musical director of the Wolverine Chorus, can be found in the performance of the chorus in the seven years he has served it.

Carl is retiring with a perfect record, one that is unmatched in the history of the Pioneer District. In seven separate contests for either the District chorus championship or the District's berth in the International chorus contest the Wolverine Chorus has been pre-eminent under Carl's leadership.

In addition to the unblemished chorus contest record while Carl has been with Oakland County, the success of our "Harmony in Review" has caused it to become the district's only annual show that is staged for two nights.

Also, during his tenure as musical director, octets and mini-choruses from within the Wolverine Chorus have been frequent winners in interchapter competition throughout the Detroit area.

Carl began barbershopping in July, 1955, as a member of the old Northwest Detroit Chapter. He was soon attracted to quartet work and sang with such groups as the Sophistachords, Dynamics, and Chordmasters. After moving to the Dearborn Chapter in 1960 Carl helped organize and sang bass in the Autotowners, a quartet that reached the apex of barbershopping in 1966 when it was named International Champion.

Before concentrating heavily on competitive quartet activity Carl had directed the Dearborn Chorus for a time, winning a District championship in 1965. His interest refocused on directing after capturing his gold medal with the Autotowners and he joined Oakland County and the Wolverine Chorus a short time later, launching the current string of successes.

In addition, he has served as a quartet coach for the Trebleshooters, the Closechorders, and the Vagabonds, as well as for several Sweet Adeline quartets.

Oakland County Chapter is grateful for the contributions Carl has made during his time with us. We are appreciative of his desire to take respite after nearly 20 years of barbershopping. We are both grateful and appreciative to his wife, Carolyn, and their children, for the hours we have "borrowed" from them.

Carl's willingness to share his musical abilities with members of the Wolverine Chorus has been matched only by his eagerness to teach a new "tag" to three men or 60. Regardless of what the future may hold for any man in this chapter and chorus we know that what we have learned from Carl Dahlke will remain with us for years to come. That, in itself, may be the finest testimony to his efforts.





THE VAGABONDS



One of the few quartets to carry Oakland County representation into the top ten of the Society's International quartet rankings, the Vagabonds are currently among the Midwest's busiest quartets.

First organized in 1969, the Vagabonds were Pioneer District Champions for 1969-70 and sang in their first international contest in 1971, placing 17th.

In July of 1972 they electrified an Atlanta audience with a first-night performance that helped carry them to a ninth place finish in the International quartet contest.

Last summer in Portland, Ore., the Vagabonds moved up two notches in the international rankings and this spring will again seek one of the two Pioneer District quartet berths available for the International contest in Kansas City.
